## Statement of Item Vetoes: Chapter 45, House File 2227

Dear Representative Kelliher:

It is my honor to inform you that I have received, approved, signed, and deposited in the Office of the Secretary of State, Chapter 45, House File 2227, with the exception of line-item vetoes listed below.

I have exercised a line item veto of the following appropriations:

Page 6, lines 6.9 – 6.14: A \$1,000,000 appropriation in Chapter 45, Article

Section 3 for a loan program for equipment used in production of
perennial crops. While this new loan program for equipment may have
merit in the future, we are only in the early stages of planning for our next
generation of bio-fuels. It is difficult to predict future equipment and
capital needs of producers of such crops at this point. Many questions
remain that should be answered before the state commits to this type of
loan program, such as what type of biomass crops or plants will be used
and how equipment needs will differ from what is used on already
established crops.

Moreover, this is an issue the NextGen Board, established in this bill, should address. The board should make recommendations to the 2008 legislature on the validity of this type of program or other type of bioenergy equipment loan programs. Speaker Margaret Kelliher Page 2 May 4, 2007

2. Page 9, lines 9.8 – 9.26: A \$350,000 appropriation in Chapter 45, Article 1, Section 3 to the Minnesota Institute for Sustainable Agriculture (MISA) for research on prairie plants and perennials. This appropriation is duplicative of funding included in the Higher Education Omnibus discussions, and similar to funding available in the Environment and Energy Omnibus finance bill. The appropriation also repeats activities supervised by the proposed NextGen Board. Finally, similar activities are already taking place within IREE at the University of Minnesota and many of the other appropriations included in this bill will accomplish the exact research this appropriation is written for.

I would encourage MISA to coordinate their research and funding needs with the overall budget requests of the University and to also consult with the University's Institute of Renewable Energy and the Environment to coordinate research efforts.
