WHEREAS: Emma Lee was very friendly and outgoing, and enjoyed many hobbies such as knitting, crocheting, and sewing; and

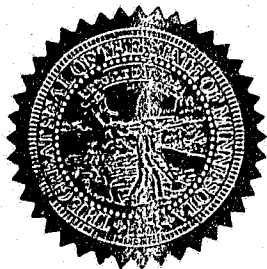
WHEREAS: Family and friends of Emma will gather to celebrate her 110th birthday on October 14, 1989;
