St. Paul, April 21, 1919.

Hon. W. I. Nolan,

Speaker of the House of Representatives.

Sir: House File No. 60 is herewith returned without my approval for the following reasons:

In the matter of purchasing food for the inmates of our various state institutions, the members of the Board of Control can be trusted to deal wisely as occasion demands.

To pass a law compelling the exclusive use of butter in state institutions would be setting a bad precedent in the enactment of such class legislation as is frequently advocated for political purposes.
