**FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL RESPONSE OF THE GOVERNOR
TO THE PETITION OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL**

Governor Mark Dayton hereby supplements his Response to the Petition of the Attorney General as follows:


1. On Exhibit B, page 3, under **Human Services**, the following phrases should be stricken:
 - A. “eligible as of 6/30/2011”; and
 - B. “Related vendor/provider payments will not continue.”
2. Upon review, the Governor has determined that further government activities are necessary, and constitute Priority One and Priority Two critical services, to protect the lives and safety of vulnerable Minnesotans in the event of a government shutdown on July 1, 2011.
3. Specifically, the Governor has determined that:
 - A. Vulnerable Minnesotans should be allowed to apply for and, if eligible, receive, cash, food, and health care assistance.
 - B. Payments should continue to Minnesota Department of Human Services vendors and providers under Medicaid, MFIP/DWP, General Assistance,

Minnesota Supplemental Aid, refugee cash assistance, Group Residential Housing, MinnesotaCare, Food Support, MN Food Assistance Program, and Adoption Assistance.

4. As July 1 approaches, the Governor will notify the Court if there are further refinements to Exhibit B.

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
SPECIAL COUNSEL TO THE
