Child Pornography	Amends definition of Child Pornography and addresses "sexting" provisions.	Sexting is the act of using text functions on cell phones to distribute pornographic images.	Several Hearings. (HF 3103/SF2437)

Gunshow Loophole	Requires sellers of guns and weapons at gunshows to conduct criminal background check on potential buyers before selling.	Background check requirement in place at gunshops/gunsellers.	Several Hearings (HF 2960)

Cell phones/Missing Persons (Kelsey Smith Act)	Requires cell phone service providers to disclose location of customer in cases where the individual is believed to be missing and at risk of "death or serious physical harm."	The bill is named after 18 year old Kelsey Smith of Kansas, abducted and murdered in 2007. For four days her family and police could not find her. Once cell phone records were turned over, within 45 minutes authorities located Kelsey's body.	Signed into law. Ch 342
