WHEREAS:	The American Cancer Society estimates that more than 600,000 people, including 9,860 Minnesotans, will lose their lives to cancer in the United States in 2017; and
WHEREAS:	The National Cancer Institute estimates up to 210,000 deaths in the United States could be avoided with early and appropriate cancer screening; and
WHEREAS:	Cancer death rates dropped 25 percent between 1991 and 2014 because of less smoking and advances in early detection and treatment; and
WHEREAS:	Cancers detected at the local stage are much more survivable than cancers detected after they have spread; and
WHEREAS:	Early detection and treatment are critical because cancer can be asymptomatic and can occur in people who have no family history with the disease; and
WHEREAS:	The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention research shows that Americans often fail to undertake commonsense cancer screening tests; and
WHEREAS:	Minnesotans are encouraged to visit cancerscreenweek.org for cancer screening resources and talk to their healthcare providers about cancer risk factors and recommended screening options.
NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim week of December 3-9 2017, as:
