## Proclamation

WHEREAS:

Birth defects can occur in any family, regardless of race, health history, economic

status, or education level; and

WHEREAS:

Birth defects affect one in every thirty-three babies and account for almost 100

infant deaths in Minnesota every year; and

WHEREAS:

Congenital heart defects, conditions present at birth that affect the structure

and function of the heart, are among the most common birth defects, affecting

nearly 40,000 infants born in the United States each year; and

WHEREAS:

Early identification of a child with a birth defect, coupled with early intervention

services, improves the child's quality of life and may even save the child's life; and

WHEREAS:

About half of all pregnancies are unplanned, contributing to late entry into

prenatal care and optimal pregnancy management, particularly during the

critical early weeks of embryonic development; and

WHEREAS:

To decrease the number of babies born with birth defects in Minnesota and across the country, the month of January is dedicated each year to raising awareness about birth defects and strategies for their prevention. Preventive strategies include taking a daily multivitamin with folic acid; avoiding alcohol and tobacco use; maintaining a healthy weight; regular doctor visits; learning about family history and genetic risks; and managing maternal medical

conditions, while minimizing unnecessary medication exposure in pregnancy;

and

WHEREAS:

The Minnesota Department of Health joins with the March of Dimes, the Organization of Teratology Information Specialists, the Teratology Society and the National Birth Defects Prevention Network, as well as many dedicated volunteers, health care professionals, and parent groups in bringing awareness to

this important cause.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of January, 2012 as:
