- WHEREAS: We give thanks for the continuing service of our heroic military men and women and law enforcement personnel and their families, whose selfless sacrifices ensure the safety and freedom we deeply cherish; and
- WHEREAS: We give thanks for the beauty of Minnesota's land and the dedication of our farm families, whose efforts put food on Thanksgiving tables across our nation; and
- WHEREAS: We give thanks for progress achieved through learning, productivity, and innovation, which makes Minnesota a leader in business and education; and
- WHEREAS: We give thanks for the quality of life we enjoy in Minnesota, due in part to our efforts in health care, high level of volunteerism, world-class educational system, and the abundance of valuable services provided to the citizens of our state; and
- WHEREAS: We must pause to reflect on our freedoms, our blessings, and our democratic way of life, and give thanks.
